to generalize their understanding of early vocabulary. This pack can be used from 18 months of age.




since it explains how speech develops and what can go wrong, and research shows that most children with Down Syndrome go through the same stages of speech development as typically developing children - just at a slower rate.

The first two steps in the See and Learn Speech Programme: Playing with Sounds and Putting Sounds Together is now available to loan from our library.

Playing with sounds includes 41 sound cards (23 consonants & 18 vowels) and a detailed guide on how to deliver the activities. The sound cards are all pictures of objects which begin with the chosen letter sound, d for drum, m for mouse. The first activity is a listening activity - children listen to the sounds as you hold up the card, the next focuses on hearing - the child has

to hear the difference between two different sounds as you hold up two cards and say one of the sounds. The third activity is a speech production activity. You hold up the card and say the sound and encourage the child to have a go at verbalizing it. the resource can be used from 6 months upwards.

S65: See & Learn Putting Sounds Together

See and Learn Speech Steps is also available to download free from the Downsed website.

This follows on from playing with sounds. It uses individual sound cards and 'combination' cards to encourage the child to blend sounds, e.g. 'it', 'oo', 'too'. The first activity involves practicing sounds in isolation and then blending them using the combination cards. The second activity practices

symbolic sound e.g. moo for cow, baa for sheep, wee for here we go down the slide.
